

COLONEL GREGORY D. EVANS
Commander, United States Army Medical Materiel Agency

Colonel Gregory D. Evans assumed the duties as Commander, United States Army Medical Materiel Agency (USAMMA) 13 August 2010. In this position, COL Evans leads the Army Medical Department's strategic medical materiel logistics agency, which consists of nearly 400 military, civilian, and contract employees, globally positioned at 12 locations worldwide and responsible for over \$1.5Billion in War Reserve and mission support items.

Before joining USAMMA, COL Evans served for three years as G4, Southeast Regional Medical Command in Fort Gordon, Georgia, where he oversaw logistics operations in the Southeast part of the United States and Puerto Rico. Prior to that, he was with the Dwight David Eisenhower Army Medical Center, serving as Director of Logistics and Interim Deputy Commander for Administration. Other significant assignments include Deputy Commander/Chief of Staff, USAMMA, Fort Detrick; G4-Chief, Medical Equipment, Plans and Readiness Division, Forces Command, Fort McPherson; Chief, Medical Logistics Plans, III Corps HQs and Battalion Executive Officer, 61st Area Support Medical Battalion, 1st Medical Group, Fort Hood; Executive Officer, Task Force MED EAGLE, Camp Eagle, Bosnia-Herzegovina; Director Materiels, Dwight D. Eisenhower Army Medical Center, Fort Gordon; Chief of Contracting, Southeast Regional Contracting Office, Fort Gordon and Brooke Army Medical Center Contracting Office, Fort Sam Houston; Director, Medical Acquisitions, Huntsville Division Corps of Engineers, Redstone Arsenal; Commander, Company C, 215th Support Battalion (FWD), 1st Cavalry Division and Commander, Company C, 502nd Support Battalion (FWD), 2nd Armored Division, Fort Hood and Operations Desert Shield and Storm; Personnel Staff Officer and Chief Supply/Services, 12th Evacuation Hospital and Platoon Leader, 583rd Medical Company, Wiesbaden, Germany.

COL Evans was commissioned a second lieutenant in the regular army in 1985, after graduating from Hampton University as a Distinguished Military Graduate with a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Management. He later earned a Master of Science Degree in Management from Webster University.

His military education includes the Medical Service Corps Officer Basic and Advanced Courses, the Medical Logistics Management Course, the Combined Arms Services Staff School, and resident U.S. Army Command and General Staff College. Additionally, he holds Level III certification in Contracting, completed course requirements for Level II certification in Program Management, and Level I in Acquisition Logistics. He also is a member of the Army Acquisition Workforce.
