SUBJECT: MES, Humanitarian Assistance (HA) Augmentation Sets

1. Purpose. To provide information on Medical Equipment Set (MES), Humanitarian Assistance Augmentation Set

2. Facts.

a. The set listed below is designed to support a CSH in conjunction with the Pediatric and Surgical Augmentation sets for initial humanitarian operations. This set is intended to provide medical supplies and equipment to treat approximately 20 civilian inpatients and 1,000 outpatients over the course of 10 days in a disaster relief, humanitarian assistance or domestic support mission.

b. The set listed below is designed to support a CSH for humanitarian operations. This set is intended to provide medical supplies and equipment to facilitate Internal Fixation surgical procedures in a disaster relief, humanitarian assistance or domestic support mission.

c. The set listed below is designed to support a CSH in conjunction with the Adult and Surgical Augmentation sets for initial humanitarian operations. This set is intended to provide medical supplies and equipment to treat 10 general pediatric inpatients over the course of 70 bed days and 100 outpatient encounters for a civilian population in a disaster relief, humanitarian assistance or domestic support mission. It includes specialized pediatric medicines, special nutrition supplements and a limited range of pediatric surgical instruments to augment the DEPMEDs equipped hospital to which it would be used.

d. These sets were documented to augment a Combat Support Hospital (CSH) and not as standalone sets. The older version HA set Unit Assemblage (UA) 1623 was authorized in a Common Table of Allowance (CTA). UAs 623A, 624A and 625A are not authorized by any CTA or any other Unit type authorization document. The Combat Developer had a set review in 2008 and developed three HA sets instead of one, due to the fact there is a need, but no authorization documents. The sets were previously authorized based on Common Table of Allowance (CTA).

f. USAMMA is currently managing two of these MES HA sets (consisting of all 3 type sets) in the PACOM theater of operation (Camp Carroll, Korea and Sagami Army Depot, Japan) and one set (consisting of all 3 type sets) in Continental United States (CONUS) (KellyUSA, San Antonio, TX), as part of the Army Prepositioned Stocks (APS) Sustainment Set, Kit and Outfit (SKOs). DA G-4 is release authority for these sets. A funded requisition is to accompany the request for release.
