The following organizations participate in the program: the FDA, the Defense Medical Standardization Board (DMSB), Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, Defense Supply Center-Philadelphia (DSCP), the Department of Homeland Security's Strategic National Stockpile (SNS), the Veterans Administration (VA), and the US Postal Service (USPS). The Universal Data Repository (UDR) is available via CD-ROM and the internet. UDR Medical Program, sponsored by the Defense Medical Logistics Standard Support (DMLSS) Office, is an automated information system consolidating medical and pharmaceutical information. The UDR provides a single source of current data for product and price comparison. Searches are available for pharmacy and med/surg items, Service Assemblage data, and Decentralized Blanket Purchase Agreements (DBPAs), and provide summary, equivalent and detail information.

The Federal Logistics Information System (FLIS) provides essential information about supply items including the National Stock Number, the item name, manufacturers and suppliers (including part numbers), freight data, hazardous material indicators, interchangeable and substitutable items, management data (such as acquisition advice code and price), and physical and performance characteristics. FLIS also provides information on contractors working the U.S. Government.
